#### **Drop In** Thursdays

There is a concept of paying it forward which exists in this country. It basically means that you buy your own coffee or meal at a shop / restaurant and then pay for another one. This is then stored up as a paid-for meal or drink, and sometimes the coffeeshop will put a receipt on a board by the entrance with a list of paid-for items so that those who really are in need can pick up a receipt and claim the free gift. It will always be anonymous, and the giver may never know or see who benefited from the gift, but that isn't the reason they do it. The heart says that they have been given much, so want to offer something back. As we look to become an even more welcoming church family, I want us to adopt that same attitude. The recent series on stewardship may have caused us to consider how we use our resources, time, money and talents for God - but the passage in the end of Mathew 25 really shows us how we can steward all God has given us to share with our neighbour. This is the real case of loving our neighbour that Jesus commands us to do - really looking out to give to someone out of the abundance we have, even if we don't know who needs it. "I was hungry and you gave me something to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink". Real welcome means being ready to be a giver - of our time, hospitality, generosity, care and non-judgemental listening and support in times of real crisis. I see this out on the streets in Guildford as a street angel. We so often get a surprised reaction when people learn that we are volunteers. Why do we volunteer, they ask. I usually respond by saying that we just want to give a little back to life, because life has given us riches in abundance. We may not have much material wealth, but we do long to offer even a little something for the least of those in need - just because we were first loved. Do you know how much Jesus loves you? Do you consider this abundant wealth? If so, how might he be challenging you to give back, even a little, to those who need to know that love. Blessings, Rev James
