Eternal God, as Mary waited for the birth of your Son, so we wait for his coming in glory; bring us through the birth pangs of this present age to see, with her, our great salvation in Jesus Christ our Lord.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke: Glory to you, O Lord

Luke 1:39-56 NIV-UK

³⁹ At that time Mary got ready and hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea, ⁴⁰ where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹ When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. ⁴² In a loud voice she exclaimed: 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! ⁴³ But why am I so favoured, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? 44 As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. 45 Blessed is she who has believed that the Lord would fulfil his promises to her!'

When I look back on the past few weeks as we have journeyed into Advent, I can see so much of what God has been doing through people, place and answers to prayer. Looking back on the past few weeks has been so exciting, because I can see the privilege of standing in a place where the Spirit of God has been moving. St Luke's has hosted three wonderful carol services; for Burpham Primary school, Christopher Robin Daycare and Nursery and our own candlelit carols over the past two weeks, with Midnight Mass to come. Singing alongside those enjoying Christmas dinners, out for the evening was a gift in itself, but to be joined by over 40 residents of Mallow Crescent and their carers, singing, signing and dancing the night away was a gift from God, and hopefully a gift to God. As we approach Christmas this year, my hope is that we would all see the gift of God in the ordinary, the work of God through the faithful and the hope of God through the sending into the world of his most precious gift of all, Jesus.
