Holy Spirit, sent by the Father, ignite in us your holy fire; strengthen your children with the gift of faith, revive your Church with the breath of love, and renew the face of the earth, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Acts 2:1-13, 4:31 NIV-UK

2 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

⁵ Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. ⁶ When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. ⁷ Utterly amazed, they asked: 'Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸ Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? ⁹ Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome ¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs – we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!' ¹² Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, 'What does this mean?'

¹³ Some, however, made fun of them and said, 'They have had too much wine.'

³¹ After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly.

Good news can come to us in many ways and circumstances. Perhaps an

inspiring story we have read about in the media or seen on the television or something of special importance in our own personal life: the birth of a new family member; the passing of an exam; or perhaps news of an endurance feat to raise money for charity.

In May, 1945, huge crowds gathered in London's West End to catch a glimpse of the Royal Family on the balcony at Buckingham Palace and to hear Churchill's victory speech, marking the end of war in Europe. It was a time for rejoicing, of families coming together, of huge street parties – a time of celebrating peace, but remembering those who had fought and sacrificed their lives for their country.

We, too, can rejoice and give thanks in our daily walk with God, as we remember Jesus' amazing sacrifice for us on the cross, in His dealing with sin and death and for the hope and joy He gives us beyond our earthly life, for those who love and serve Him.

Before His ascension into Heaven, Jesus commanded his disciples to 'go and make disciples of all nations'. We, too, are called to be messengers of the 'good news'. In what ways can we and do we respond to that call – in our conversation with others, our prayer life and in our faith in action?
