John 14:15-31 NIV - UK

¹⁵ 'If you love me, keep my commands. ¹⁶ And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you for ever -¹⁷ the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you. ¹⁸ I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. ¹⁹ Before long, the world will not see me any more, but you will see me. Because I live, vou also will live. ²⁰ On that day you will realise that I am in my Father, and you are in me, and I am in you.²¹ Whoever has my commands and keeps them is the one who loves me. The one who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love them and show myself to them.' ²² Then Judas (not Judas Iscariot) said, 'But, Lord, why do you intend to show yourself to us and not to the world?'²³ Jesus replied, 'Anyone who loves me will obey my teaching. My Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. ²⁴ Anyone who does not love me will not obey my teaching. These words you hear are not my own; they belong to the Father who sent me. ²⁵ 'All this I have spoken while still with you, ²⁶ But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.²⁷ Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid. ²⁸ 'You heard me say, "I am going away and I am coming back to you." If you loved me, you would be glad that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I.²⁹ I have told you now before it happens, so that when it does happen you will believe. ³⁰ I will not say much more to you, for the prince of this world is coming. He has no hold over me, ³¹ but he comes so that the world may learn that I love the Father and do exactly what my Father has commanded me. 'Come now: let us leave.

Have you ever found yourself lost on the way? Did you curse the lack of map-reading or the usually infallible sat-nav let you down because it wasn't updating quickly enough? I love maps - especially pouring over a large OS map on a dining table. I love seeing the rich details, noticing how places link together and most importantly seeing a possible route from A to B. When I have spotted the route, I will always look for a more efficient route - perhaps an even faster one so that I have used the map well. When walking, this has often been a blessing - the ability to follow my nose with a keen sense of direction and good memory of the twists and turns of a route even before opening the map again. Yet, I have on a number of occasions, left the path and ended up on a bog walk - a route through rough terrain that wasn't intended to be walked or traversed. Not intentionally trying to get myself lost, I have found the need to retrace steps and start again, or get muddy. No major harm done! But, the walk and the way is a metaphor Jesus used so often - to describe life with him. Once he ascended to Heaven, he promised the gift of the Holy Spirit to help us on the way. Tim Keller describes the Holy Spirit's work as guiding us along a narrow path with ditches on either side. So the Spirit holds us fast when we are close to veering into the ditch, and also points us towards Jesus by staying straight on the path. Sometimes this 'holding us fast' can feel painful or like a sharp course correction, but it is only to stop us deviating far from our Heavenly Father, and it is absolutely because he loves us and longs for us to stay the course. Our challenge is to let the Spirit work in us, to guide and direct us - but also to correct and convict us when we have followed to much our own desires. Are we willing? Blessings, Rev James
