God our saviour, look on this wounded world in pity and in power; hold us fast to your promises of peace won for us by your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ.

Galatians 5:13-26 NIV-UK

¹³ You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love. ¹⁴ For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' ¹⁵ If you bite and devour each other, watch out or you will be destroyed by each other.

¹⁶ So I say, live by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. ¹⁷ For the flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh. They are in conflict with each other, so that you are not to do whatever you want. ¹⁸ But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law.

¹⁹ The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; ²⁰ idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions,

factions²¹ and envy; drunkenness, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God.

²² But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. ²⁴ Those

who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. ²⁵ Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit. ²⁶ Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other.

When was the last time you played the game: 2 truths and a lie? It is a brilliant ice-breaker to help people get to know each other and work out new and interesting facts about one another, while trying to discern the red herring. The game is interesting not least because it helps draw us closer together, but it also points out the obvious question: how do we know something is true? I could add, another question: how can we be people of the truth? In all of this wonderful discourse that Jesus brings to his disciples at the last supper, John captures the rich challenges Jesus lays down for them. He is anxious that they need help testifying about the truth of his life, and anxious that they will go astray - so need to be reminded of how to live his way, his truth and his life. Both come from 14:6, a verse William read a couple of weeks back – "I am the way, the truth and the life. Noone comes to the Father, except through me." So, we need to testify to the truth - Jesus - so we need the Holy Spirit as our guide to discern truth. We need to stay the course for Jesus - so we need to know his way and truth as our divine path. In a world which seems to validate and celebrate untruth, it is now more important than ever that we are people of the truth – his truth. So where do we find our source of truth? Whenever people ask this, I am always directing people to Jesus, the Spirit of truth; to his word. In a world which Jesus entered with a revolutionary counter-cultural message, he is the same yesterday, today and forever, so it shouldn't surprise us that the message of Jesus, and his way, stands counter cultural. It is only in his strength that we can stand firm for him. Blessings, Rev James
