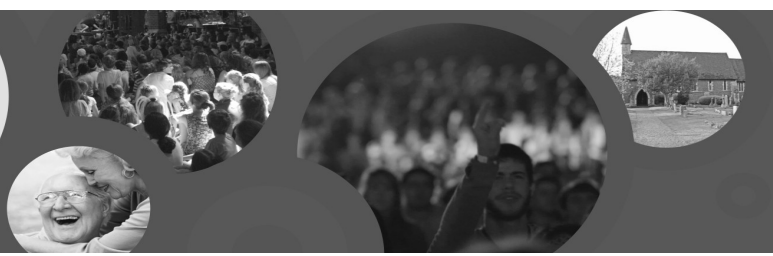

What is the best gift you have ever been given at Christmas? How about the worst? Often, we might lament the practical gifts (socks, books, toiletries), but secretly we are glad of those that we deem necessary. Maybe we are in a privileged position whereby we can buy what we want when we want it / need it, so Christmas ideas are in short supply, hence we get practical gifts. In schools, I was usually blessed with gifts at Christmas – always grateful for those gifts and the families giving them. I soon realised in teaching that I needed to be more open with what I really valued rather than leave it to chance. Soon enough, I started sharing with families how I valued dark chocolate and real ale – as I had been given many bottles of wine (which I don't very often drink), or more eclectic gifts. One year I received a giant teddy, and a box of scented botanicals – I thought, did my lounge smell that bad? Even a bottle of mango liquor. Lots of generous gifts, but we compared notes amongst staff to see if we were alone, or joined in gifting. The error was often to not say anything!

This week, we have just passed Epiphany - the marking of the journey to the new-born King made by magi from the East. All we know from the gospels was that they lived a life marked by prayer, discernment and obedience to the new King. What they brought him were fantastic value gifts, of great symbolism - even if not quite as practical as they might have been. But where we often fail to notice is that they were living a life of true obedience - they followed God's invitation to come to Jesus, and they were present for him - kneeling down to present him gifts both of material nature and more importantly their lives. This new year, what gifts are you going to bring to the King, Jesus?

My challenge for us all is three-fold: **Prayer, Invitation and Presence.** Might you take up bringing those to Jesus this year? Blessings, Rev James
